### Notes from Session

#### May 5 via Zoom

At the May 5th Zoom Session meeting only one session member was unable to attend. Music Director Lyn Patterson, Treasurer Aubrey Moore, Reverend Katelyn Gordon Cooke and Reverend Andy Cooke were also present.

Andy opened the meeting with a discussion of the movie *Groundhog Day*, in which we were encouraged to share things that we appreciate in the midst of living the same day repeatedly in this time of pandemic.

Treasurer Aubrey informed Session that congregational giving remains strong. Although the preschool received the \$15,000 from Covenant, there will still be a shortfall in the overall preschool budget partially due to the cancellation of Summer Fun.

The Sustainability Ministry Team submitted updated Personnel Policies which the Session approved with a few changes. The Sustainability Team also submitted an updated job description for the Music Director/Organist which was approved.

Katelyn informed Session that the Deacons continue to be very busy ministering to the congregation through the three teams: Prayer team with biweekly prayer time, Visitation team with calls and cards and the Meals team which is still developing the best system possible for meeting food needs of the congregation.

# From our Pastor

People often talk about "plan B" as if it were a bad thing. Plan A is the best thing to do, but if things don't work out, then we'll settle for plan B. It is the backup plan that is rarely called upon. Until recently, it never occurred to me how privileged we all are to live in a world where plan B is usually the end of the conversation. Over the past three months, we have all gone far past plan B for most things in our lives. We are at plan G or H, and longing for the days when plans never went past B.

Like many of you, I had vacation plans this summer. I was taking the boys camping for a week in Utah, and we were going to see all five of the national parks there. Plan B happened when both of my flights were cancelled, and we added a day on either end of the trip. Plan C happened when both of my flights were again cancelled, and I asked for a refund so that I could book another airline. Plan D happened when it became clear that a trip to Utah would not be safe at this time, and we booked campsites at Great Smokey Mountains National Park in one of the more remote campgrounds. Plan E happened when those reservations were cancelled by the

National Park Service. At the moment, the plan if for the boys and me to camp during the first week in June on private land near Bryson City, NC far away from any other campers. If the tent doesn't leak and we catch one trout, then we will call it a success. I hope that plan F does not materialize, for that would be camping in the backyard. If it rains too hard in the backyard and we come inside, then I guess that would be plan G.

We have gone down this same line at Covenant. Remember in mid-March when we were going to limit in-person gatherings for a couple of weeks while the virus mysteriously disappeared? I think that we are probably on plan G or H now, which you can see in the pages of this newsletter. Plans seem to change so frequently now that the newsletter is almost dated when it hits your mailbox. The session has created a task force to help us safely reopen our property. That task force presented a report to the session on June 2, which is why we delayed the *Chimes* by a week. We wanted to make sure that you receive the latest information, which you can find on pages 3 and 4.

Session decided to extend the COVID-19 provisions to June 12. Brock Daniels made a motion to form a task force to work out the provisions for reopening the facility. Following the affirmative vote, Gail Kouame, Judy Grieve, Chris Terry, Debbie van Tuyll, Katelyn Cooke and Andy Cooke volunteered to serve on the task force.

The Session reviewed the Church-Preschool Relationship document written by Andy, Katelyn and Preschool Director Lauren Stull. The document was approved and will be shared with all concerned parties.

Session will hold a meeting on July 7, 2020 to stay current with any needs of the congregation.

Katelyn stated that both she and Andy are most grateful for messages they are receiving each week thanking them for their time and efforts preparing online worship services, as well as staying in touch with members via Zoom. They have begun to work on summer Sunday mornings and look forward to sharing this time with the congregation in addition to the regular worship services.

The next Session meeting will be June 2, 2020 via zoom.

## Open the Gates Task Force Covenant Presbyterian Church

## Stage 1 Recommendations

The Open the Gates Task Force was created by the Session of Covenant Presbyterian Church on May 5, 2020 to make recommendations about how to reopen the property to in-person gatherings in a safe and responsible way. These recommendations represent stage 1 of the plan to return to the property. We believe that we are called by God to be stewards of our property and our community, and that our stewardship is an act of worship. Through these recommendations, we aim to show the love of God within our community while maintaining our core values of hospitality, compassion, and inclusiveness.

#### SANCTUARY WORSHIP

Beginning June 14, worship will be held in the sanctuary at 11:00 a.m. only (not at 8:30 a.m.) and live streamed to the congregation through Vimeo. A recording of this live stream will be emailed to the congregation later in the day. A picture of the congregation will be taken at every service for the purposes of contact tracing.

- 1. June 14: begin live-streaming
  - Only Pastors and support volunteers (liturgist and AV Team member(s)) will be present.
  - On June 14, there will be NO congregation members present.
- 2. June 21, 28, July 5, & 12: congregation begins attending (limited seating)
  - Only 50 present each Sunday:
     10 support volunteers (liturgist, AV Team member(s), and ushers) and 40 members
  - Priority will be given to first-time stage 1 attendees, who make reservations on Mondays via phone or email to Judy Strogonoff. Only 40 reservations will be made. Beyond 40 people, first-time stage 1 attendees will roll over to the next Sunday.
  - People who have already attended a stage 1 service should make reservations on

- Tuesdays. These reservations do not roll over to the next week.
- Everyone must wear a mask (we will provide a mask for those who don't have one).
   Masks may only be removed by speakers at the pulpit or lectern.
- Bulletins will be placed in pews (on Fridays) so that people know where to sit.
- Ushers will seat and then dismiss by row. Usher teams may be reduced as they are only responsible for seating, general safety and security, and putting the offering into the safe.
- Offering will be collected in boxes near the exits.
- No choir or congregational singing.
- No other in-person gatherings (including Sunday School), no coffee bar, no name tags, no nursery, no children's church, and no time with children. Children's worship bags will be removed from sanctuary.
- Greeters will be in the Aumond Road parking lot to welcome people from afar and remind them about masks.
   Signage will also remind people about masks and social distancing.

- Ushers will prop open exterior doors near the Aumond Road lot and interior doors to the sanctuary so that people do not need to touch handles.
   Exterior doors should be closed at the start of worship and reopened at the end of worship.
- Worshippers should park in the Aumond Road lot and enter the building through doors that are already propped open
- Worshippers are asked to not congregate before or after worship, and to maintain 6 feet of distance from others. Please do not greet anyone in any way that requires physical touch.
- From June 21 through July 12, the sanctuary will be open for silent prayer from 12:30-1:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoons. No reservations are necessary, but a mask must be worn at all times. The organist may provide music for reflection during a portion of this time and will be responsible for locking up. The organist will record attendance for the purposes of contact tracing.

#### **CHURCH OFFICE**

The church office will reopen on June 15, 2020. The Church Secretary and Finance Secretary will resume their normal office hours. Other staff members will work from home or from a different part of the building when possible. Walk-in visitors will not be permitted. All visitors should make an appointment before coming to the office. EVERYONE who enters the office is required to wear a mask. Employees have the option to remove masks when they are at their own desks and no one else is in the room. All visitors to the office will be recorded by the Church Secretary for the purposes of contact tracing.

#### **OTHER GATHERINGS**

While groups are still encouraged to meet via Zoom, gatherings of 10 or less people are permitted in the building beginning June 15. All gatherings must be scheduled with the church office. Masks are required. Every group is responsible for cleaning and disinfecting the space after using it.

- Gatherings of 10 or less people may be held in the Fellowship Hall.
- Gatherings of 6 or less people may be held in other rooms.
- Groups are welcome to gather outside at any time.
- Attendance for all gatherings should be maintained by the group leader for 30 days following the event for the purposes of contact tracing.

#### **GENERAL**

- Hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, and masks will always be available at the main entrances to the building.
- Everyone who enters the building should maintain social distance of six feet.
- Everyone who enters the building should wear a mask when in the presence of others.
- Anyone who feels sick in any way should not come to the property and should seek medical guidance.
- Ring doorbell cameras on two main entrances will record entry to building to assist with contact tracing.

#### COMMUNICATION

This plan will be published in the June edition of the *Chimes*, posted at the main entrances to the building, uploaded to the website, and linked in the Friday emails. A phone tree message will alert people to look for the details of the plan in the *Chimes*.

Approved by the Session on 6/2/2020. Subsequent stages of this plan will be determined at a later date. In the event of new CDC recommendations or local health developments, these provisions may change, and such changes will be communicated to the congregation.

# The Relationship Between Covenant Preschool and Covenant Presbyterian Church

On May 5, 2020, the Session adopted a document to help define the relationship between the preschool and the church. While this document was intended for leaders and staff, we thought that it might be helpful for members of the congregation to see an abbreviated form of this statement in print. If you would like to see the full version, then please contact the church office.

In January of 1961, only two years after Covenant Presbyterian Church was founded, a committee was formed to study the need for establishing a kindergarten. By September of that year, "Covenant Weekday Kindergarten" opened its doors for the first time less than a year after the building was completed at 3131 Walton Way. Since that time, Covenant Preschool has been an integral part of the life and mission of Covenant Presbyterian Church.

Covenant Preschool operates under the guidance and direction of the Session of Covenant Presbyterian Church. The preschool is not, and never has been, a separate entity. Over the years, various committees, teams, or boards have held the responsibility for oversight of the preschool on behalf of the Session. Ultimately, the Session has always maintained the responsibility for the preschool on behalf of Covenant Presbyterian Church.

Legally, Covenant Presbyterian Church is a domestic nonprofit corporation in the state of Georgia

(Covenant Presbyterian Church in Augusta, Incorporated) and a 501(c) (3) subordinate unit of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Covenant Preschool is not a registered corporation and has no tax status with the federal government. Covenant Preschool is also not a subsidiary of Covenant Presbyterian Church. Legally, Covenant Preschool IS Covenant Presbyterian Church. As such, Covenant Presbyterian Church pays insurance for all property used and liabilities incurred by virtue of having a preschool.

All staff members of Covenant Preschool are employees of Covenant Presbyterian Church. Covenant Presbyterian Church issues all paychecks, withholds taxes, and pays worker's compensation insurance for all preschool staff. All employees of Covenant Presbyterian Church, including preschool staff, are accountable to the Session through the supervisor listed in their job description and/or letter of employment.

Recently, the Session reorganized itself to reduce the number of people and committees required to maintain its ministry structure. One result of that reorganization is that there is no longer a committee dedicated to the preschool. Instead, two ministry teams have oversight of different facets of the preschool. The Sustainability Ministry Team oversees preschool finance and personnel. The Education Ministry Team oversees preschool program and curriculum. These two ministry teams should make reports to the Session regarding the preschool whenever they become available.

Covenant Preschool has a rich history at Covenant Presbyterian Church and in the Augusta community. It is our hope that establishing clarity of roles and responsibilities will help this preschool to remain strong for years to come. We are grateful for the staff, students, and families of Covenant Preschool and we are eager to continue to develop our partnership in ministry as we look to the future.
